That he had intimate acquaintance with Christopher M^c Nanny the above named soldier for about 65 years, and first knew him in the town of Waddington N.Y. about the year 1844

That he and the soldier were employed in the town (now city) of Burlington Vt. a few years after, and soldier there married one Rosa Sagan, who died there a short time after said marriage and about the year of 1847, or 1848, which fact of death he knows by reason that he was present at her funeral & burial, and had known her well while living -

That a short time after, or within a few years, both soldier & himself ^{had} returned to Waddington N.Y. and soldier there married Margaret White (now his widow) in the year 1853 or thereabouts

That he has had intimate acquaintance with soldier & his family ever since this last marriage & knows soldier & claimant to have lived constantly together as husband & wife up to death of soldier, and is morally certain they were never divorced & she has not remarried

That he is also morally certain that soldier had not been married prior to his marriage with Rosa Sagan and that he had been a widower some years before his last marriage, to claimant
